¹⁷ 'See, I will create
new heavens and a new earth.
The former things will not be remembered,
nor will they come to mind.
¹⁸ But be glad and rejoice for ever
in what I will create,
for I will create Jerusalem to be a delight
and its people a joy.
¹⁹ I will rejoice over Jerusalem
and take delight in my people;
the sound of weeping and of crying
will be heard in it no more.

²⁰ 'Never again will there be in it
an infant who lives but a few days,
or an old man who does not live out
his years;
the one who dies at a hundred
will be thought a mere child;
the one who fails to reach a hundred
will be considered accursed.
²¹ They will build houses and dwell in them;
they will plant vineyards and eat their fruit.
²² No longer will they build houses and
others live in them,
or plant and others eat.
For as the days of a tree,
so will be the days of my people;
my chosen ones will long enjoy
the work of their hands.
²³ They will not labour in vain,
nor will they bear children doomed
to misfortune;
for they will be a people blessed by the LORD,
they and their descendants with them.
²⁴ Before they call I will answer;
while they are still speaking I will hear.
²⁵ The wolf and the lamb will feed together,
and the lion will eat straw like the ox,
and dust will be the serpent's food.
They will neither harm nor destroy
on all my holy mountain,'
says the LORD.

Acts 10: 34-43

³⁴ Then Peter began to speak: 'I now realise
how true it is that God does not show
favouritism ³⁵ but accepts from every nation
the one who fears him and does what is
right. ³⁶ You know the message God sent to
the people of Israel, announcing the good
news of peace through Jesus Christ, who is
Lord of all. ³⁷ You know what has happened
throughout the province of Judea, beginning
in Galilee after the baptism that John
preached – ³⁸ how God anointed Jesus of
Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power, and
how he went around doing good and healing
all who were under the power of the devil,
because God was with him.
³⁹ 'We are witnesses of everything he did in
the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem.
They killed him by hanging him on a
cross, ⁴⁰ but God raised him from the dead on
the third day and caused him to be seen. ⁴¹ He
was not seen by all the people, but by
witnesses whom God had already chosen – by
us who ate and drank with him after he rose
from the dead. ⁴² He commanded us to preach
to the people and to testify that he is the one
whom God appointed as judge of the living
and the dead. ⁴³ All the prophets testify about
him that everyone who believes in him
receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'

Luke 24: 1-12

*When the Gospel is announced:
Glory to Christ our Saviour.*

¹ On the first day of the week, very early in the
morning, the women took the spices they had
prepared and went to the tomb. ² They found
the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ but
when they entered, they did not find the body
of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ While they were
wondering about this, suddenly two men in
clothes that gleamed like lightning stood
beside them. ⁵ In their fright the women
bowed down with their faces to the ground,

but the men said to them, ‘Why do you look for the living among the dead? ⁶ He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: ⁷ “The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.” ⁸ Then they remembered his words.

⁹ When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others. ¹⁰ It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them who told this to the apostles. ¹¹ But they did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense. ¹² Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb. Bending over, he saw the strips of linen lying by themselves, and he went away, wondering to himself what had happened.

Praise to Christ our Lord.*
