Thanks to those who have already responded. Vestry meet on June 21st to start the task of drafting a budget for next year and hope to make as informed a decision as possible.

MIDDLE CHURCH are raising funds to build a school toilet block and 2 individual toilets through the charity toilet twinning (www.toilettwinning.org). Some of the poorest communities on our planet have no access to a toilet. This means those who live in those communities suffer from preventable diseases and illness and often lose their lives to them, especially young children. So building toilets saves lives! To reach our goal we need to raise £360 and to do this we will be doing an 8mile sponsored cycle, then hosting a movie night in the church hall (you're all invited! 7:30pm-9:30pm, cost £5) before spending the night sleeping rough in the rectory garden. James 5: 13-16

¹³ Is anyone among you in trouble? Let them pray. Is anyone happy? Let them sing songs of praise. ¹⁴ Is anyone among you ill? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. ¹⁵ And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven. ¹⁶ Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.

Acts 3: 1-10

¹ One day Peter and John were going up to the temple at the time of prayer – at three in the afternoon. ² Now a man who was lame from birth was being carried to the temple gate called Beautiful, where he was put every day to beg from those going into the temple courts. ³ When he saw Peter and John about to enter, he asked them for money. ⁴ Peter looked straight at him, as did John. Then Peter said, ‘Look at us!’ ⁵ So the man gave them his attention, expecting to get something from them. ⁶ Then Peter said, ‘Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk.’ ⁷ Taking him by the right hand, he helped him up, and instantly the man’s feet and ankles became strong. ⁸ He jumped to his feet and began to walk. Then he went with them into the temple courts, walking and jumping, and praising God. ⁹ When all the people saw him walking and praising God, ¹⁰ they recognised him as the same man who used to sit begging at the temple gate called Beautiful, and they were filled with wonder and amazement at what had happened to him.

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Luke 7: 1-10

*When the Gospel is announced:
Glory to Christ our Saviour.*

¹ When Jesus had finished saying all this to the people who were listening, he entered Capernaum. ² There a centurion’s servant, whom his master valued highly, was ill and about to die. ³ The centurion heard of Jesus and sent some elders of the Jews to him, asking him to come and heal his servant. ⁴ When they came to Jesus, they pleaded earnestly with him, ‘This man deserves to have you do this, ⁵ because he loves our nation and has built our synagogue.’ ⁶ So Jesus went with them. He was not far from the house when the centurion sent friends to say to him: ‘Lord, don’t trouble yourself, for I do not deserve to have you come under my roof. ⁷ That is why I did not even consider myself worthy to come to you. But say the word, and my servant will be healed. ⁸ For I myself am a man under authority, with soldiers under me. I tell this one, “Go”, and he goes; and that one, “Come”, and he comes. I say to my servant, “Do this”, and he does it.’ ⁹ When Jesus heard this, he was amazed at him, and turning to the crowd following him, he said, ‘I tell you, I have not found such great faith even in Israel.’ ¹⁰ Then the men who had been sent returned to the house and found the servant well.

Give thanks to the Lord for his glorious Gospel. Praise to Christ our Lord.
